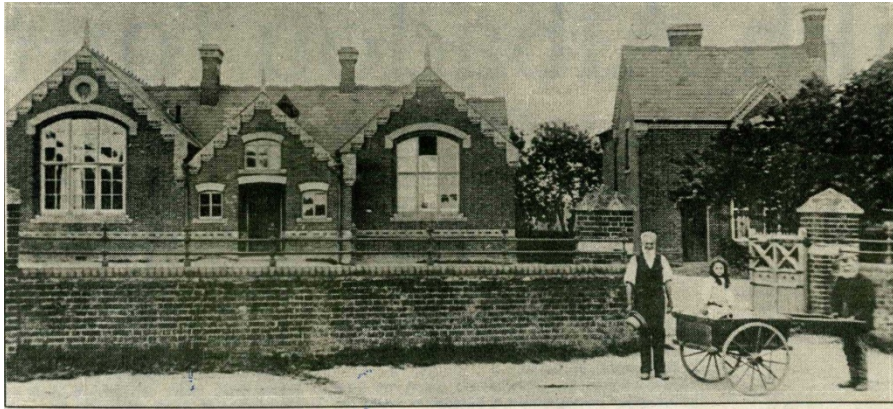


WICKHAMBROOK SCHOOL



ALF Hicks our Wickhambrook correspondent writes of this picture of the village school taken between 1912 and 1915.

The school was built in 1878 and is one of the oldest surviving locally.

In the picture with a handcart from Woollards' shop is Humphrey Eagle, at the time a well known figure in the village. He always bought Old Moore's Almanack and was fond of quoting its predictions.

With him is the daughter of the photographer, the Rev Farrington, who produced a lot of postcards and sold them at the post office and shops in the village.

The other character pictured is Charles Wright,

both he and Humphrey worked for T R Woollard, grocers and drapers. He was well known as a lively Methodist preacher not afraid to express himself loudly with Hallelujah and Praise the Lord.
