

# RULES FOR THE FLOWER SHOW

- Any garden produce offered for competition must have been grown by the exhibitor in his/her own garden or allotment.
- 2. The Pot Plant must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for not less than three months
- 3. That, if any exhibitor shows as his/her own, any produce not grown by himself/ herself, or uses any means to deceive the Judges, the Committee shall have the power to exclude him/her from exhibiting at any future time. The Committee reserves the right to inspect any garden or allotment before awarding prize.
- Horticultural exhibits must be at the Show between 8.00am and 10.00am on the day of the Show and must not be removed before 5.00pm.
- Exhibitors must bring their exhibits in their own dishes or baskets, roots must be clean except where otherwise stated, and in a fit state for exhibition.
- No exhibitor may win more than one prize in any one Class. The Judges will take into consideration the quality rather than the size of the exhibits.
- It will be left entirely to the decision of the Judges to grant extra prizes as they think fit.
- The Committee will not, under any circumstances, be responsible for any loss, damage, or non-delivery of any article exhibited at the Show, but will take all reasonable care.
- Unless there are four exhibits in the Class, Judges will use their discretion as to whether to award a third prize.
- 10. Any question of status to be determined by Committee
- 11. All carrots, Beet, Turnip tops, etc. to be NO MORE THAN 4" IN LENGTH

#### RECIPE FOR ORANGE, ALMOND AND YOGHURT LOAF

This simple and quick-to-make loaf is a lovely afternoon treat. Putting yoghurt in the sponge keeps it moist and rich and the orange zest livens things up. Serves 8 - 10

#### Ingredients

190g (7oz) unsalted butter, plus extra for greasing 190g (7oz) plain flour, plus extra for dusting 1 tbsp finely grated orange zest 190g (7oz) caster sugar 3 large eggs 60g (2oz) ground almonds 1tsp baking powder Quarter tsp salt 25g (1oz) plain yoghurt 1 tsp vanilla essence 10g (third of an oz) flaked almonds

One  $8.5 \times 17.5$  cm  $(3.5 \times 7 \text{ in})$  loaf tin with 7.5 cm (3 in) sides. Preheat the oven to 170C, (325 F), gas mark 3 then grease the loaf tin with butter and dust with flour.

Using a hand held electric whisk or a freestanding electric mixer with the paddle attachment, cream together the butter, orange zest and sugar until the mixture is soft and fluffy. Add the eggs one at a time, whisking well after each addition. Scrape down the sides of the bowl every now and then to ensure the eggs and butter are properly mixed in.

In a separate bowl, mix together the flour, ground almonds, baking powder and salt. Tip the dry ingredients into the creamed mixture in two batches and whisk together on a low speed until just incorporated, then mix in the yoghurt and vanilla essence.

Pour the batter into the prepared loaf tin and sprinkle the flaked almonds on top. Place in the oven and bake for 50-60 minutes or until the sponge is firm on top and a skewer inserted into the centre of the cake comes out clean. Remove from the oven and allow the loaf to cool a little before turning it out of the tin on to a wire rack to cool completely before serving.
